When I shop, I tend to wander. I don't have laser focus in the grocery store. That's changed somewhat recently. I'm reminded of my mission by the friendly interrogation I get from Sidney upon entering and by the bright orange arrows guiding my movements through the store. When I've been there, it seems like the stores been completely taken over by high schoolers, whose part-time jobs to provide spending money, down payments for cars, or college are suddenly "essential." Essential workers have, of course, always been essential to our communities, and now is a good time to recognize our friends and neighbors for service they provide, to thank them, to thank God for them and to cover them with prayer. There no reason this should change when the virus is gone.

As talk of (and, to the South, protest for) the reopening of normal life begins to swirl, let us be careful to avoid sloganizing or snap judgements. There is always a calculus at work consciously and unconsciously calculating risks. (We calculate the risks, count the cost, when we head to Brandon on an icy morning--our lives and the lives of other motorists.) Be that as it may, let us take care in our thinking (and acting) when it comes to adding to the risk essential workers and those with underlying health issues are exposed to. They will bear the brunt of the increased health risk. The former because of all their social contact, the latter because they truly suffer if they contract the Covid-19 virus. Let us rely on of the life of Jesus (and Jesus as the Way, Truth and Life) as our guide for action and reasoning in the world.
